## **IMPORTANT ELECTION INFORMATION FOR 2024**

Voting at the Polling location is available for all elections. Additionally:

- In-person Early Voting and Vote-by-Mail will be available for State and Federal Elections (Primary & General).
- Vote-by-Mail *only* will be available for the Town Election.
- For the Whittier School District special election voting is in-person only on January 23 (date subject to change).

If you are already registered to vote in Rowley, you do not need to re-register to vote. However:

- If you have moved to or from Rowley, or if you have changed your name, please update your information online or come in to the Town Clerk's office to do so.
- If you wish to change your political party affiliation for a given election, you must do so <u>before</u> the "last day to register to vote" for that election. You may do so online or at the Town Clerk's office.

When requesting vote-by-mail for a <u>Primary</u> election:

- If you are registered to vote as "unenrolled" (no political party affiliation), you MUST select the party whose Primary Ballot you wish to vote. *This does not change your enrollment status*.
- If you are enrolled in a party, you will be sent that party's ballot automatically.
- Vote-by-mail applications must include the applicant's signature.

NOTE: You may be asked to show identification upon check-in at your polling place if:

- You are voting for the first time in Massachusetts in an election
- You are an inactive voter
- You are casting a provisional or challenged ballot
- The poll worker has a reasonable suspicion that leads them to request identification
- Acceptable identification must include your name and the address at which you are registered to vote.

## Examples of acceptable identification include:

- A driver's license in your name showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- A state-issued ID card in your name showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- A recent utility bill in your name showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- A rent receipt in your name showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- A lease in your name showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- A copy of your voter registration affidavit showing the address at which you are registered to vote.
- Any identification which contains the voter's name and address at which they are registered to vote.

If you are voting for the first time in an election in Massachusetts after registering to vote by mail, you may be required to show identification under federal law.

It is recommended that you include a copy of your identification with your mail-in voter registration form. If you don't, you may be asked for identification when you go to your polling place on Election Day.

If you can't present identification at check-in, you may cast a provisional ballot and return later with identification. If you don't come back with acceptable identification by close of polls, your ballot can't be counted.
